Event Rules

- 1) Firing of airsoft arms is only allowed at the field range and at the designated competition targets. Airsoft guns in other areas (such as parking lot) must be unloaded and safety on.
- 2) Please do not abuse anything in the park. Do not hack the trees or the structures or rip branches or plants. Be respectful of the land and the organization hosting the event.
- 3) Stay on the trail. Do not cut cross country to the next designated target.
- 4) Everyone must sign an event participation waiver.
- 5) Participants must be 14 years old or be accompanied by an adult.
- 6) All guns must be inspected before being allowed in competition.
- 7) All guns must have a working safety.
- 8) Range Judge decisions are final.
- 9) Only allowed bb's are biodegradable (available upon registration).
- 10) It is strongly encourage that all airsoft arms be transported in a case or covered when in a vehicle.
- 11) 3-D archery range is open at the same time as Airsoft Sportsman Sim. Archers are allowed to "shoot through" and pass airsoft participants.

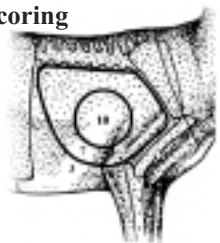
Event Scoring

Three classes; Adult, High School (14-18), Under 14.
Competitions are in the following categories.

Marksman	50 points
Wildlife Identification	10 points
Safe Handling Scenarios	15 points
Shoot/Don't Shoot	20 points
Proper Deer Tag	5 points

Marksman 3-D Target scoring

within inner prime vitals	10 points
within outer prime vitals	7 points
body shot not in vitals	3 points

Approved Airsoft Arms

Only sportsman style arms are approved for Airsoft Sportsman Sim. Single shot and semiautomatic action are allowed. No full automatic action is allowed during the event. All arms brought to Airsoft Sportsman Sim must be inspected by range officer. A limited number of rentals will be available.

- All airsoft arms must have a working safety.
- All arms must shoot 6mm or 8mm airsoft bb's.
- All arms must have blaze orange safety tip

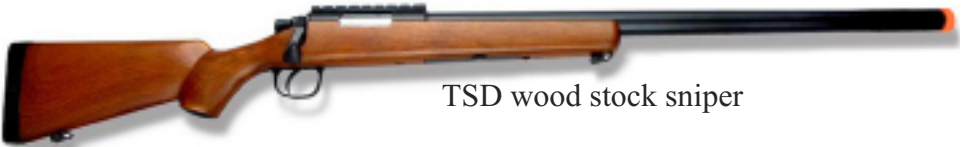
Rifles

Rifles must have a full stock. Fixed sights or telescopic sights are allowed. Action can be single shot bolt, semiautomatic, or lever. Power can be spring, automatic electric, or gas. Tactical rails, laser sights, tactical flashlights are not allowed.

Handguns

Airsoft handguns are not permitted in Airsoft Sportsman Sim competition.

Shotguns

Shotguns must have a full stock. Pistol grip on full stock is acceptable. Fixed sights or telescopic sights are allowed. Power can be spring, automatic electric, or gas. Tactical rails, laser sights, tactical flashlights are not allowed. Shotguns modified to sportsman style are allowed. Shotguns must be single bb, no multi-shot allowed.

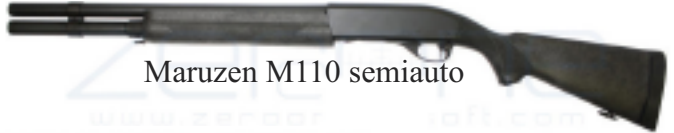

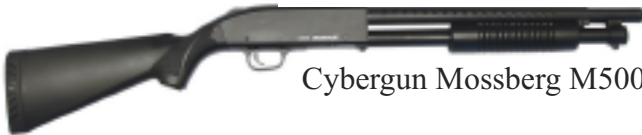

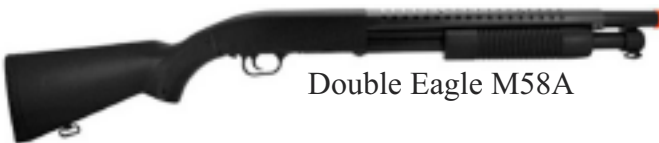

The Ten Commandments of Firearm Safety

- 1. Watch that muzzle!** Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
- 2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.**
- 3. Be sure of the target and what is in front of it and beyond it.** Make sure you have an adequate backstop—don't shoot at a flat, hard surface or water.
- 4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot.**
- 5. Check your barrel and ammunition.** Make sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions, and carry only the proper ammunition for your firearm.
- 6. Unload firearms when not in use.** Leave actions open, and carry firearms in cases and unloaded to and from the shooting area.
- 7. Point a firearm only at something you intend to shoot.** Avoid all horseplay with a gun.
- 8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.** Unload a firearm before you climb a fence or tree, or jump a ditch. Pull a firearm toward you by the butt, not the muzzle.
- 9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.** Store each in secured locations beyond the reach of children and careless adults.
- 10. Avoid alcoholic beverages or any mind- or behavior-altering medicines or drugs.** Keep a clear head if handling firearms.
